

## BARN RULES

The Jubilee Lunch Event is being held on the land outside the Tithe Barn with the kind permission of the Oxford Museums Trust and Oxfordshire County Council. We know villagers will enjoy the celebrations whilst also respecting the historic site, but need to share a few 'Barn Rules' in advance for everyone to be aware of.

- ✓ **Wear sensible footwear** – *the area around the barn is uneven and can be slippery. Think flats rather than stilettos.*
- ✓ **Supervise children** – *this is an event for all, including children. Parents are though asked to keep an eye on and be responsible for little ones whilst onsite.*
- ✓ **Dress for the weather** – *in torrential rain the event will be relocated to the village hall which has been booked 'just in case'. We don't plan to let a good old British summer rain shower put us off though. Check the weather in advance and prepare accordingly.*
- ✓ **Be covid aware** – *we all have different levels of comfort with covid, so respect others and make the most of sanitisers made available across the site.*
- ✓ **No breakables please** – *we've been asked to request that disposable cups and plates are used instead of anything breakable to reduce the risk of injury.*
- ✓ **Keep it tidy** – *there will be a tidy-up operation at the end, but to help those volunteering for this please take your rubbish home with you.*
- ✓ **No parking at the Barn** – *people are asked to avoid driving to the site unless necessary.*
- ✓ **No pets please** – *f you really can't leave the goldfish, pony and dog behind, please keep them on lead and be ready to clear up after them.*
- ✓ **More info on the day** – *you'll spot official event volunteers who'll each have a stylish union jack sash. The official information point will be the arrival desk should you need to locate it on the day.*
- ✓ **A maximum of 20 in the Barn** – *we've been asked to avoid crowds forming in the Barn, which will be open for visitors and also bathroom facilities.*
- ✓ **Make sure you have fun** – *the most important rule of the day!*
